

**A briefing by Professor Jonathan Turley regarding a court challenge
to Pub. L. 110-135 that violates
a host of constitutional and statutory provisions**

Renowned constitutional attorney and law professor, Jonathan Turley, J. B. and Maurice C. Shapiro Professor of Public Interest Law, George Washington University Law School, is holding a press briefing to address selected key members of Congress, their staff and the news media on the current litigation before the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia which could result in the repudiation of Public Law No. 110-135 as unconstitutional. It is a seminal case, the second in less than a decade in which Professor Turley is involved, which could create a binding precedent on Congress that would limit its future ability to administer waiver and immunity provisions. He will explain why this recent legislation, which was signed into law on December 13, 2007, violated a host of constitutional and statutory provisions, effectively resulting in the termination of the jobs and benefits for thousands of combat aviation veterans, who were senior commercial airline pilots, as well as other non-military senior pilots, solely on the basis of age.
